Be a Blessing to the Body of Christ By Loving Devotion to Your Spiritual Siblings – Part 2 Unto the Growth of the Body

A key component of our life together as members of Christ's body is helping one another to develop and mature personally and spiritually.

In **Ephesians 4**, we see the plan laid out:

- Step 1: Christ gives gifted men to the church for the equipping of the congregation for ministry. (vs.10–12)
- Step 2: The congregation grows in unity and maturity as a result of the ministry of the gifted men. (vs.13-14)
- Step 3: The equipped, mature congregation functions as intended, each one ministering according to his/her own giftedness for the growth of the church. (vs.15–16)

This afternoon we will look at five ways Scripture teaches you how to contribute to the growth of the body through one-another ministry.

I. One Another – Romans 14:1

- Take careful note of the actions that we are commanded to do and not to do toward one another in this chapter.
- What kind of attitudes toward our brothers and sisters will we have if we follow Paul's instructions in this chapter?
- Think of a sacrifice you may need to make if you are caring for your spiritual siblings in these ways.
